Who are we?

The Alliance Healthcare Foundation is a not-for-profit philanthropic organization supporting the mission of Central Florida Health Alliance (Leesburg Regional Medical Center & The Villages Health System). Who benefits?

Since 1977, the Alliance Healthcare Foundation has invested resources in hospital programs and services, technological advancements, community education, preventative care and new equipment. Although the Foundation has expanded with the growth of our community, our commitment to supporting compassionate and sophisticated healthcare in our community has remained the same as it was more than three decades ago.

Where do we operate?

Our Foundation puts our generous donors' charitable gifts to work improving healthcare for people throughout Lake, Sumter and South Marion Counties from our hospitals in Leesburg and The Villages, from ancillary facilities such as our Alliance Labs, The Villages Health System Lab, and Alliance First Care, and through partnerships with other local medical facilities in our community.

The Alliance Healthcare Foundation is under the direction of a CEO. The Foundation's Board of Directors consists of 20 members who are broadly representative of the community.
